Mathematics Made Easy

No other school subject has earned the dubious reputation of being one of the most difficult to tackle other than Mathematics. However, it cannot be denied that proficiency in the subject is integral to both the academic and professional success of a person.

And although instructors play a vital role in helping kids hone mathematical skills, students should not ignore the need for them to take a proactive stance in gaining mastery over the subject.

Mastering Concepts

One reason students may be lagging behind in the subject is that they might view it as another subject that requires memorization. One of the key elements in mastering the subject is understanding the underlying concepts. As such, instead of simply practicing, you should set aside ample time learning the basic concepts and how to utilize them in solving numerical problems.

Training to write numbers legibly

A substantial amount of mistakes students commit when solving equations can be attributed to illegible numbers. Imagine mistaking the number seven for number one or eight for three and the results will definitely lead to the wrong solution. This problem can easily be remedied by getting the practise in writing numbers in a neat and legible manner.

Beyond Homework Assignments

Homework assignments are crucial for reinforcing the learning done within the confines of the classroom. However, most students simply breeze through these instead of making proper use of them in order to truly master the subject. The best way to maximize the utility of assignments is to learn the habit of poring through the textbooks and looking at the samples included.

However, most students can profit greatly beyond completing their assignments. Kids should set time aside for additional work beyond the assigned tasks. This will further strengthen the student's mastery of the concepts while reinforcing his confidence that can be carried on to the classroom setting.

Hope students understand these basic concepts and make Mathematics their true friend!

Conserving Our Environment

Our environment is an integral part of life. Environment comprises of various resources which are essential to our lives. You name an activity of the life, be it our eating, drinking, breathing, working, resting or any actions, with all of these we are surrounded by our environment. Therefore the quality of environment affects our quality of life and existence. Environment includes the atmosphere, geographical components, natural resources etc. around us.

In the ancient times, the people used to live mostly in accordance to their environment but as the technological and scientific advances kept coming into existence. And the industrial revolution brought the world towards the new age; the use of the environment remained under exploitation knowingly and unknowingly.

The causative factors for harm towards the environment, due to its exploitation have been:

1. Deforestation: The massive reduction in the spread and the amount of our forests and vegetation has been mainly caused by 1. Industrial Spread 2. Rapid Urbanization
2. Loss of Bio Diversity- When forests are depleted, which are natural habitat of various insects, birds, animals etc.: these species find it difficult to survive and those unable to struggle against the adversities come near extinction. Their extinction does a loss to the environment that can't be compensated.
3. Water Pollution- Pollution of the usable water has been caused by the excessive use of water by humans, mixing of impure water into clean water, lack of possibilities of its recycling and the mixing of polluted water and poisonous industrial chemicals as water.
4. Air Pollution- Emissions of harmful gases from industries, automobiles, spread of the waste out of our day to day living; the lack of vegetation has been causing and increasing the pollution in the air.
5. Population Explosion- The underlying cause of the above discussed factors and situation is directly the excessive and rapid rise in the population.

These factors have harmed our environment in various ways, i. e.:

1. Depletion of water under the surface of Earth- Deforestation, excessive use of water has brought the state of depletion of water under the surface. We all know that without usable water, survival is not possible.
2. Global Warming- Though the Greenhouse gases keep our Earth warm, without the Greenhouse gases, the average temperature of the Earth's surface would be about 18 degrees Celsius, instead of the present average of 15 degrees but the intensification of the Greenhouse effect has been causing the problem of Global Warming.
3. Depletion of Ozone Air: The air pollution intensifying the Green house effect and causing Global Warming is resulting into depletion of Ozone layer which has been the protective layer of atmosphere against the Sun's Ultraviolet radiations.
4. Depletion of Oil, Gas and Minerals: The natural reserve of oil, gas and minerals are getting depleted fast due to over consumption



which adversely affects natural environment.

5. Natural Calamities- The entire imbalance caused by the damage in the environment has been resulting in cyclones, floods, draughts, famines that are ruining lives and materials at large.

Taking the above causes and concerns into consideration, this becomes the utmost need of our time that we all understand the necessity to protect our environment through conservation. We must

1. Follow recycling and regenerative mechanisms.
2. Use the natural resources judiciously.
3. Control pollution.
4. Make efforts to keep environment green.
5. Conserve the Bio-diversity.

राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में हिन्दी का स्वाभिमान

किसी भी देश की पहचान उसके साहित्य भाषा व संस्कृति से होती है। हिन्दी राष्ट्रीय चेतना, राष्ट्रीय स्वाभिमान, सम्मान और राष्ट्रीय एकता का एक मात्र माध्यम है। हिन्दी सिर्फ एक भाषा नहीं सदियों लम्बा एक ऐसा सफर है, जिसमें कई मोड़, कई पड़ाव हैं। देश के महान व्यक्तियों, स्वतंत्रता सैनानियों तथा साहित्यकारों के लम्बे संघर्ष के बाद 14 सितम्बर 1949 के दिन संविधान निर्माता सभा ने "हिन्दी" को भारत संघ की राजभाषा के रूप में मान्यता दी थी। लेकिन कई दशक पूर्ण होने के बाद भी आज हिन्दी को उसका वास्तविक दर्जा प्राप्त नहीं हो सका है।

हिन्दी आज विश्व में सर्वाधिक समझी जाने वाली भाषा है। इसकी लिपि वैज्ञानिक और शब्दावली सांस्कृतिक आधार सम्पन्न है। हिन्दी में संत कबीर, तुलसीदास से लेकर प्रसाद, पंत, निराला, हजारी प्रसाद द्विवेदी, दिनकर इत्यादि अनेक कवियों और लेखकों की एक लम्बी शृंखला है। महात्मा गांधी, पं.जवाहर लाल नेहरू, सुभाषचन्द्र बोस आदि नेताओं ने हिन्दी को राष्ट्रीय आंदोलन का अभिन्न अंग बना दिया था। यह बलिदान की वीरों की प्रेरणा स्रोत व करोड़ों भारतीयों की धड़कन है, जो राष्ट्र को एकता के सूत्र में बाँध सकती है। हिन्दी मात्र एक भाषा ही नहीं, वह भारत की स्वत्व, अस्मिता, संस्कृति और विकास का प्रतीक है। राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में हिन्दी के स्वाभिमान को हमें इसी परिप्रेक्ष्य में समझना होगा। राष्ट्रभाषा हिन्दी का मान रखे बगैर राष्ट्र के सम्मान की कल्पना नहीं की जा सकती। राष्ट्रभाषा के प्रयोग से ही राष्ट्र का नाम गौरवशाली होगा।

हिन्दी भाषा के समस्त शब्दों का ज्ञान अपने अन्तः मन की तिजोरी में रखकर आप अन्य भाषाएँ जैसे - तेलगु, तमिल, मलयालम, बंगाली, गुजराती, मराठी आदि बड़ी सुगमता से सीख सकते हैं। इसका व्याकरण तो समस्त भाषाओं के व्याकरण की जननी है।

राष्ट्रभाषा हिन्दी राष्ट्रीय स्थानीय तथा वैश्विक विविधताओं के बीच एक व्यावहारिक सेतु की भूमिका निभा रही है। आज हिन्दी का एक अंतर्राष्ट्रीय स्वरूप एक महत्व है। जिसे हिन्दी ने अपनी योग्यता द्वारा अर्जित किया है। इन सारी स्थितियों और विशेषताओं की दृष्टि से राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में हिन्दी के स्वाभिमान को अक्षुण्ण बनाए रखना हम सभी सजग एवं जागरूक रचनाकारों, पत्रकारों विचारकों एवं चिंतकों का न केवल नैतिक दायित्व बनता है, बल्कि यह हमारा राष्ट्रीय कर्तव्य भी है क्योंकि "हिन्दी के स्वाभिमान से होगा देश का सम्मान"।

Last but not the least, practice, practice, practice and then do some more practice.


Practicing language is undeniably the best way to learn and improve.

“वर्तमान समय में संस्कृत भाषा की प्रासंगिकता”

भाषासु मुख्या मधुरा दिव्या गीर्वाण भारती।

तस्यां हि काव्यं मधुरं तस्मादपि सुभाषितम्।

अर्थात् भाषाओं में सर्वाधिक मधुर भाषा, गीर्वाण भारती, देवभाषा संस्कृत है। संस्कृत साहित्य में सर्वाधिक मधुर काव्य है और काव्यों में सर्वाधिक मधुर सुभाषित है। संस्कृत भाषा प्राचीनतम एवं प्रथम भाषा है। सम उपसर्ग पूर्वक धातु से 'क्त' प्रत्यय से संस्कृत शब्द निष्पन्न हुआ है। जिसका अर्थ है तैयार, शुद्ध, परिष्कृत एवं श्रेष्ठ भाषा। इसे देववाणी, सुरभारती, देवभाषा भी कहा गया है। यह संसार की सभी भाषाओं की जननी है, अतः इसे "सर्वभाषाणां जननी" भी कहते हैं। सृष्टि के आरम्भ में ही ईश्वर ने इसी भाषा में वेदों का ज्ञान दिया था। यह भारतीय संस्कृति एवं सभ्यता का मूर्त एवं सजीव रूप है। इस भाषा में ही हमारी सांस्कृतिक विरासत सुरक्षित है। संस्कृत वाङ्मय हजारों वर्षों पुराना है। हमारे अधिकांश ग्रन्थ इसी भाषा में रचित हैं। इसी परम्परा में रचित "श्रीमद् भगवद्गीता" ने न केवल भारतीयों को अपितु अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर लोगों को कर्म करने के लिए प्रेरित किया। लोग कहते हैं कि संस्कृत रोजगार की भाषा नहीं है, इसे क्यों पढ़ें? लेकिन सत्य इसके विपरीत है। दुनिया भर में संस्कृत का कारोबार (व्यवसाय) सालाना 150 मिलियन डॉलर का है।

वैज्ञानिकों का मानना है कि संस्कृत एक कोडेड लैंग्वेज है जिसके चलते यह अंतरिक्ष में संदेश भेजने के लिए सर्वोत्तम है। इसके जरिये एक लाइन की बात एक शब्द में कही जा सकती है। इसलिए ही अमरीकी अंतरिक्ष नासा में भर्ती होने वाले वैज्ञानिकों के प्रशिक्षण काल में 15 दिन की संस्कृत की कक्षा लगती है। जिसमें उन्हें संस्कृत भाषा के ज्ञान के साथ-साथ मयदानव का दिया सूर्य सिद्धांत तथा आर्यभट्ट व वराहमीहिर जैसे वैज्ञानिकों के सिद्धांतों को सिखाया जाता है। कम्प्यूटर के लिए भी सबसे उपयुक्त भाषा संस्कृत ही मानी गई है।

इतना ही नहीं लंदन के सेंट जेम्स स्कूल में 5 वीं तक स्टूडेंट्स के लिए संस्कृत अनिवार्य विषय है। अमेरिका में संस्कृत को स्पीच थेरेपी के रूप में स्वीकृति मिल चुकी है। वहाँ के अनेक विश्वविद्यालय में संस्कृत विषय पर शोध कार्य किया जा रहा है। संस्कृत की प्रसिद्धि यहाँ तक ही सीमित नहीं है। अमेरिका व अन्य देशों का मानना है कि संस्कृत पढ़ने से बच्चों का मानसिक विकास तेजी से होता है। उनकी स्मरण शक्ति बढ़ती है तथा एकाग्रता में वृद्धि होती है। इसलिए ही वहाँ के लोग आध्यात्मिक शांति के लिए संस्कृत के ग्रन्थों का अध्ययन कर रहे हैं।
